EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. RESOLUTION 1 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF TRANCHE 1 PLACEMENT SHARES

1.1 Background to the August 2025 Placement

The Company announced on 13 August 2025 that it had received firm commitments from institutional, sophisticated and professional investors for a two-tranche placement of approximately 52,173,914 Shares at an issue price of \$0.575 per Share to raise \$30,000,000 (before costs) (**August 2025 Placement**).

On 21 August 2025, the Company issued 20,300,000 Shares to raise approximately \$11,672,500 (before costs) pursuant to the Company's 7.1A mandate which was approved by Shareholders at the annual general meeting held on 28 May 2025 (being, the subject of Resolution 1) (**Tranche 1 Placement Shares**).

Subject to Shareholder approval, a further 31,873,914 Shares will be issued to institutional, sophisticated and professional investors in accordance with Listing Rule 7.1 to raise a total of \$18,327,500 (before costs) (being, the subject of Resolution 2) (**Tranche 2 Placement Shares**).

Bell Potter Securities Limited (ACN 006 390 772) (**Bell Potter**) acted as sole lead manager and bookrunner to the August 2025 Placement. Bell Potter was paid an equity raising fee equal to 5% of the funds raised under the August 2025 Placement (excluding GST).

The Company intends to apply the proceeds raised under the August 2025 Placement in the following manner:

 - (a) the Company's exploration activities warrant further exploration activities; or
 - (b) the Company identifies additional acquisition or investment opportunities,the Company's working capital will also be utilised to fund such further exploration activities and/or acquisition or investment costs (including due diligence investigations and expert's fees in relation to such acquisitions or investments) as applicable.

1.2 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder ratification for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Tranche 1 Placement Shares. The Shares were issued on 21 August pursuant to the Company's capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A.

1.3 Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12-month period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A however, an Eligible Entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%. The Company obtained this approval at its annual general meeting held on 28 May 2025.

The issue does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.1A for the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

1.4 Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under Listing Rule 7.1 and so does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue.

1.5 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If this Resolution is passed, the issue will be excluded in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of the issue.

If this Resolution is not passed, the issue will be included in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of the issue.

2.2 Listing Rule 7.1

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 1.3 above.

The proposed issue does not fall within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and exceeds the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1. It therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

3.1 Background to the May 2025 Placement

As announced on 12 May 2025, the Company had received firm commitments from institutional, sophisticated and professional investors for a placement of approximately

30,500,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.275 per Share (**May Placement Shares**) to raise approximately \$8,400,000 (before costs) (**May 2025 Placement**).

30,458,100 May Placement Shares were issued pursuant to the Company's capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 (being, the subject of Resolution 3).

Bell Potter Securities Limited, Morgans Corporate Limited and Blue Ocean Equities Pty Ltd acted as joint lead managers to the May 2025 Placement. The joint lead managers were paid an equity raising fee equal to 6% of the funds raised under the May 2025 Placement (excluding GST).

3.2 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder ratification for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of 30,458,100 May Placement Shares to the institutional, sophisticated and professional participants in the May 2025 Placement.

The issue of the May Placement Shares did not breach Listing Rule 7.1 at the time of the issue.

3.3 Listing Rule 7.1

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 1.3 above.

The issue does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

3.4 Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. The terms and conditions of the Performance Rights are set out in Schedule 1.

Resolutions 4 to 7 seek Shareholder approval for the issue of the Performance Rights to the Related Parties (or their nominee(s)).

4.2 Director recommendation

Each Director has a material personal interest in the outcome of Resolutions 4, 5, 6 and 7 on the basis that all of the Directors (or their nominee(s)) are to be issued Performance Rights should Resolutions 4, 5, 6 and 7 be passed. For this reason, the Directors do not believe that it is appropriate to make a recommendation on Resolutions 4, 5, 6 and 7 of this Notice.

4.3 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act requires that for a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The issue constitutes giving a financial benefit and each of the proposed recipients is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director.

As the Performance Rights are proposed to be issued to all of the Directors, the Directors are unable to form a quorum to consider whether one of the exceptions set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act applies to the issue of the Performance Rights. Accordingly, Shareholder approval for the issue of Performance Rights to the Related Parties is sought in accordance with Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act.

4.4 Listing Rule 10.11

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue equity securities to:

- 10.11.1 a related party;
- 10.11.2 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the company;
- 10.11.3 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so;
- 10.11.4 an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3; or
- 10.11.5 a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders,

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

The issue falls within Listing Rule 10.11.1 and does not fall within any of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12. It therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 10.11.

Resolutions 4, 5, 6 and 7 seek the required Shareholder approval for the issue of the Performance Rights to the Related Parties under and for the purposes of Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act and Listing Rule 10.11.

(h) **Timing of issue of Shares on conversion**

- (i) issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of Performance Rights converted;
- (ii) if required, give ASX a notice that complies with section 708A(5)(e) of the Corporations Act, or, if the Company is unable to issue such a notice, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors; and

- (iii) if admitted to the Official List of ASX at the time, apply for official quotation on ASX of Shares issued pursuant to the conversion of the Performance Rights.

If a notice delivered under paragraph (h)(ii) for any reason is not effective to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors, the Company must, no later than 20 business days after becoming aware of such notice being ineffective, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors.

(i) **Transfer of Performance Rights**

The Performance Rights are not transferable.

(j) **Participation in new issues**

A Performance Right does not entitle a holder (in their capacity as a holder of a Performance Right) to participate in new issues of capital offered to holders of Shares such as bonus issues and entitlement issues without exercising the Performance Right.

(k) **Reorganisation of capital**

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reorganised (including consolidation, subdivision, reduction or return), all rights of a holder will be changed in a manner consistent with the applicable ASX Listing Rules and the Corporations Act at the time of reorganisation.

(l) **Adjustment for bonus issues of Shares**

If the Company makes a bonus issue of Shares or other securities to the Company's existing shareholders (other than an issue in lieu or in satisfaction of dividends or by way of dividend reinvestment) no changes will be made to the Performance Rights.

(m) **Dividend and voting rights**

The Performance Rights do not confer on the holder an entitlement to vote (except as otherwise required by law) or receive dividends.

(n) **Change in control**

Subject to paragraph (o), upon:

- (i) a bona fide takeover bid under Chapter 6 of the Corporations Act having been made in respect of the Company and:
 - (A) having received acceptances for not less than 50.1% of the Company's Shares on issue; and
 - (B) having been declared unconditional by the bidder; or
- (ii) a Court granting orders approving a compromise or arrangement for the purposes of or in connection with a scheme for the reconstruction of the Company or its amalgamation with any other company or companies; or
- (iii) in any other case, a person obtains Voting Power (as defined in the Corporations Act) in the Company that the Board (which for the avoidance of doubt will comprise those Directors immediately prior to the person acquiring that Voting Power) determines, acting in good faith and in accordance with their fiduciary duties, is sufficient to control the composition of the Board,

then, to the extent Performance Rights have not converted into Shares due to satisfaction of the Milestone, Performance Rights will accelerate vesting conditions and will automatically convert into Shares on a one-for-one basis.

For the avoidance of doubt, this clause applies notwithstanding any other provision of this plan, including paragraph (d). Performance Rights will not lapse on a Change of Control but will instead convert into Shares in accordance with this paragraph.

(o) **Deferral of conversion if resulting in a prohibited acquisition of Shares**

If the conversion of a Performance Right under paragraphs (c) or (n) would result in any person being in contravention of section 606(1) of the Corporations Act (**General Prohibition**) then the conversion of that Performance Right shall be deferred until such later time or times that the conversion would not result in a contravention of the General Prohibition. In assessing whether a conversion of a Performance Right would result in a contravention of the General Prohibition:

- (i) holders may give written notification to the Company if they consider that the conversion of a Performance Right may result in the contravention of the General Prohibition. The absence of such written notification from the holder will entitle the Company to assume the conversion of a Performance Right will not result in any person being in contravention of the General Prohibition; and
- (ii) the Company may (but is not obliged to) by written notice to a holder request a holder to provide the written notice referred to in paragraph (o)(i) within 7 days if the Company considers that the conversion of a Performance Right may result in a contravention of the General Prohibition. SCHEDULE 2 – VALUATION OF PERFORMANCE RIGHTS TO RELATED PARTIES

The Performance Rights to be issued to the Related Parties pursuant to Resolutions 4 to 7 have been valued by internal management. Internal management's assessment of the value of the Performance Rights is based on an assessment of the likelihood of achieving the Milestone, which it has determined to be 50%.

The value of the Performance Rights on this basis, using the closing share price on 3 September 2025 of \$0.695, is \$0.348 per Performance Right.
